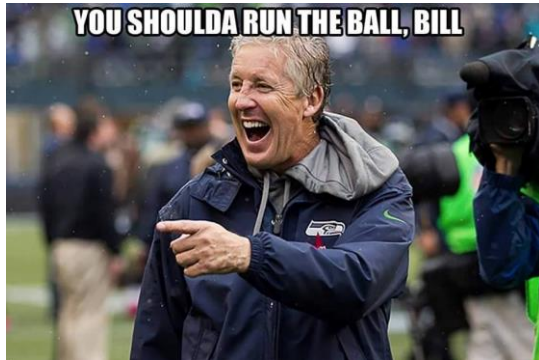

together in the same box.

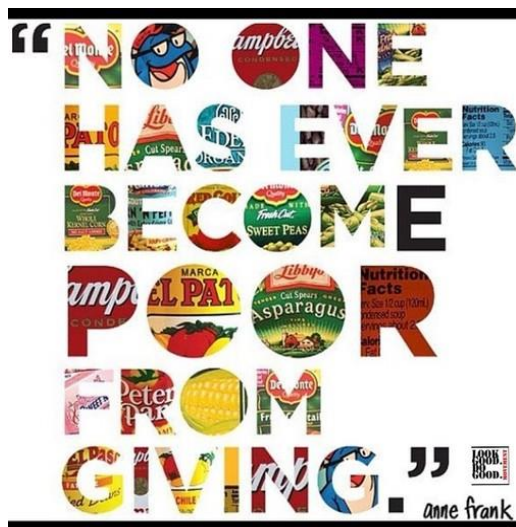
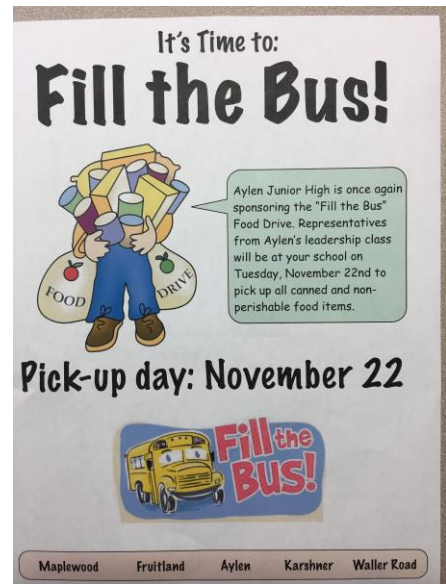

Thanksgiving Break is Next Week!

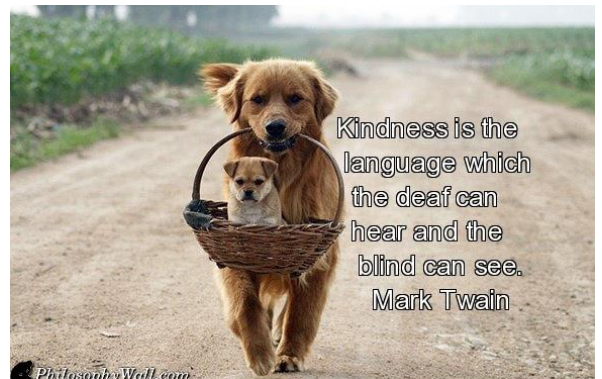
